Course description

The Danish Research School for Information Systems (DaRSIS) has the pleasure of inviting for a two-day PhD course on the classic research streams of IS.

The course focuses on familiarizing and inspiring PhD students in the IS domain with the different traditions and research areas of the IS tradition. The aim is to give PhD students with diverting backgrounds an overview of some of the traditional streams of IS research and methodologies and help them shape their dissertations to fit these streams. After completing the course students should be clearer about where they make their contribution to the IS community through their research.

Each session will consist of an approx. one hour talk delivered by a member of the faculty followed by approx. half hour of discussion related to the topic of the talk. The themes of the sessions are:

- IS history
- Acceptance of technology
- Systems development
- IT in organizations
- Business and IT
- Human-Computer Interaction
- Qualitative IS methodology

Student presentations

Each PhD student attending the course will be asked to do a 10 minutes presentation of her or his PhD project including – but not limited to:

- Background
- Research question
- Overview of theories and methodology
- Expected contribution
- Current status of the project

After each presentation there will be approx. 15 minutes for comments and discussion of the presentation. Each participating student must submit the title and an abstract of the presentation no later than **January 18th 2010**. Depending on the final number of participants, student presentations may be done in groups with representatives from faculty present.
